1. Llangyfelach Community Council

- 1.1 Llangyfelach Community Council was formed on 15 November 1979. It consists of 9 Councillors, who are appointed through election or co-option.
- 1.2 This report sits within the 2017-2022 & 2022-2027 Council Terms.
- 1.3 Councillors Margaret Boyter & Gareth Sullivan chose not to seek re-election at the Local Government Elections in May 2022. Both Councillors had been faithful servants to Llangyfelach, with Councillor Sullivan having been a founding member of the Community Council. Sadly, Councillor Boyter died shortly before the Election.
