### Council Action Plan 2026-2027

1. **Introduction**
2. Section 52 of the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021 requires all Community Councils to prepare and publish an Annual Report about the Council's Priorities, Activities and Achievements during that financial year. It is to be published as soon as reasonably practicable after the end of the financial year. The Annual Report is a backward-looking report.
3. To aid the compilation of the Annual Report, it would assist if the Council set out an Action Plan detailing the Council's aims, objectives, and actions it wishes to achieve for a forthcoming year. The Action Plan is a forward-looking document.

5. The draft Council Action Plan is set out in **Appendix A**. Council is asked to consider the draft Council Action Plan and to amend it as required. Council initially considered this at its meeting on 9 April 2026, but chose to defer it to the June Council Meeting.
6. The Annual Meeting of Council held on 12 May 2026, also suggested that the following items could be added to the Council Action Plan 2026:2027:
  - Llangyfelach Community Council to consider facilitating training / information sessions such as How to get online, Defibrillator Training, First Aid Training, How to set up a Power of Attorney etc. courses and to engage with Age Cymru.
